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Background & Scope

The Canadian College of Technology and Business (CCTB) maintains strict policies regarding in-class, combined, and distance learning methodologies. This allows us to maintain our objective of successfully training students with an informed framework on course content delivery and ensuring teaching and learning effectiveness within programs.

This policy applies to all current students and faculty members at CCTB.

Purpose of the Policy

This policy defines in-class, combined, and distance course delivery at CCTB.

Definition of Methodologies:

In-class: A teaching model where students attend and participate in in-class learning at the institution.

Combined: A teaching model where students attend classes both in-person and online.

Distance: A teaching model where students complete all learning online and remotely over the internet.

Policy Statement

In accordance with the Student Attendance Policy, students must maintain a minimum of 60% attendance during their program to graduate. Attendance is assessed and attributed equally for in-class, combined, and distance classes
